CONFESSION AND CLEANSING

MESSAGE FROM PASTOR



Psalm 32:5
I acknowledged my sin to you, and I did not cover my iniquity; I said, "I will confess my transgressions to the Lord," and you forgave the iniquity of my sin.

Selah

Psalm 32 provides a very candid journey of discovery about the power of confession. After an undisclosed sin which many schol-

ars believe was David's sin with Bathsheba, the sinning psalmist decided to embark on a path that is all too familiar to us. He decided to cover or hide his sin. He would just pretend nothing had happened and continue with his life. He quickly discovered that hidden sin is extremely corrosive and eats away at our insides (verses 3-4). If felt to him as if his bones were wasting away. He felt like God had a heavy hand upon him. He had no vitality. He was overwhelmed with non-stop inner groanings. Finally, he can bear the agony no lon-

ger. He confesses his sin before God ... and God forgave him!

All of us know what it is to be weighed down by the guilt and shame of our sin. We willfully violated the will of God to indulge our fleshly pleasures. We knew what we intended to do was wrong - we may even have been admonished by caring confidantes as David was (2 Samuel 11:3) – but we sinned nevertheless. Now the guilt is unbearable. We are too ashamed to go to God. What excuse can we give? God knows all the details of our betrayal. How can we look Him in the eye? He sees through our facades. So, we languish in the mire of our shame. Finally, we can stand it no longer. We must confess. Our sin is eating us up. We will face the consequences. We will accept whatever punishment God decrees. We deserve it. Even death is better than this dreadful spiritual torment.

We come clean. We acknowledge our sins. We make no excuses. We take full responsibility. Our hearts are racing. What will God do? Our disregard for Him is inexcusable. We were willing to sully His glorious reputation before His enemies to satisfy our ungodly thirst (2 Samuel 12:14).

What fierce judgments will such effrontery ignite? To our surprise, even shock, God graciously forgives us. We can hardly believe it. It is not that our sin was insignificant. It is not that God condones our sin. It is that God loves us and longs to cleanse us and relieve us of the terrible strain of our sin. What God wanted all along was for us to be honest with Him. To come clean. He knows what we have done, but if we fail to acknowledge and turn from our sin, we cannot experience His forgiveness.

What have you done that continues to weigh you down? What are you hiding because you are too ashamed to admit it before God and face His just wrath? Come humbly and honestly to Him. Confess your sins and you will be gloriously surprised to find He offers forgiveness and cleansing (1 John 1:9). That is the way to take care of sin – if we confess, God will cleanse. Confess to Him today! You will break out rejoicing as David did: "Be glad in the LORD, and rejoice, O righteous, and shout for joy all ye upright in heart" (Psalm 32:11).
