ANXIOUS? PRAY

MESSAGE FROM PASTOR



Philippians 4:6-7
Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

We face numerous anxiety-inducing cir-

cumstances in our lives. There are the daily stresses of life such as responsibilities we are not sure we can meet, and relationship tensions we are not sure we can manage. Then there are major calamities that can descend in a flash or creep inexorably towards us as slow-moving disasters. If those real-world scenarios aren't enough, we often conjure up numerous dreadful possibilities in our minds that are scarier than reality. The result of this

volatile cocktail is stressed out, anxious people – more than 50% of Americans report that they experience stress regularly. Is there any solution to this quandry?

Yes, there is! God invites us to turn to Him in times of difficulty and distress. God does not promise us that there will be no challenges, but He tells us that instead of descending into worry, we should come to Him in prayer. And yet for many of us prayer itself can be another cause for anxiety because many times we do not receive the answers we desire. Therefore, we fret about the cause of this "denial." Do we have the right prayer "formula"? Are we praying according to the will of God? Are we living perfect lives? Is God mad at me? We compound our anxiety because of a common misunderstanding about prayer.

We often forget that God loves to answer our prayers. We convince ourselves that we must somehow impress God in order to make

Him favorable to us. We forget Jesus' teaching in the Sermon on the Mount that God takes constant care of us (Matthew 6:25-34). When we come to God in prayer, we should lay our requests before Him and trust Him to answer in His own time and in His own way because God's way and timing are always best. Even when we are bothered by doubts in our prayers, we should pray about that. Be honest with God and ask Him to help us to rest in Him. The Bible promises that as we choose to pray instead of worry God will dispatch His unbelievable peace to guard our hearts.

Whatever is causing you anxiety today, may God help you to bring it humbly and trustingly to Him in prayer, and may His peace descend upon your soul as He promised.
