But as for you, continue in what you have learned and have firmly believed, knowing from whom you learned it 15 and how from childhood you have been acquainted with the sacred writings, which are able to make you wise for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus.

OVERCOMING ERROR

rom its earliest days, the church of Jesus Christ has been beset by false teachers. Some were jealous for their culture like the early Judaizers who felt that Christianity undermined the primacy of their religious practices. Some misunderstood the amazing concept of grace and decided to pervert grace into sinful abandon. Others, zealous for holiness, established strict outward principles and practices that petrified the heart of Christianity and made it a harsh, joyless experience. Yet in the midst of all this misunderstanding and sometimes intentional perversion, God has maintained a clear pathway to true Christianity.

Christians are encouraged to learn the Scriptures and hold fast to them. Addressing the young preacher Timothy, Paul acknowledged that error and deceit would flourish in the world around him, but Timothy wouldn't have to fall prey. As long as he recognized that there is no substitute for the in-

tentional, humble devotion to tive. He may not always get Bible study. While it requires patient, diligent study, honest Bible study helps the Christian not just by the wealth of knowledge he acquires, but also by how the Bible transforms his mind and philosophy of life. As his thinking becomes more aligned to Scripture the Christian discovers that he has less appetite for error – no matter how appealing it appears. In fact, his spiritual palate, having now become acclimatized to the pure rich milk of the Word, can barely stand the horrid taste of error. He almost instinctively spits it out of his mind.

But this Christian has also moved beyond the plane of mere intellectual knowledge. He is living out the Word in his daily life. As a result, the principles of Scripture have been tested and proven in his life. He now knows from experience that God's ways are best. He is not distracted by the latest worldly or religious fad. He is settled and certain that God's Pastor James ways are practical and effec-

the results he desired, but God is changing him to understand and believe that God's ways are always best. If and when God overrides his expectations, he has learnt to rest in God's infinite wisdom and love.

Such a Christian is a difficult place for error and sin to flourish. The soil of his life is too well-watered by the truth. His relationship with Jesus is too real. Like the disciples when challenged by Jesus about whether they too would abandon him like the crowds who found some of His teachings too difficult for them to swallow, we will respond: To whom shall we go? You have the words of life" (John 6:67-68).

May God help us to study and practice His Word until they become a natural defense against false teachings and errors.
