LOVED TO LOVE

It is wonderful to be loved and know it. What joy it brings to our hearts to know that someone cares for us. That someone is deeply committed to us. We can find many reasons not to love others, but one profound, positive reason overcomes all the negatives. God loved us sacrificially. If God so loved us, we also ought to love one another. When we become distracted by the faults of others and when their shortcomings loom so large that we determine them undeserving of our love, let us turn our gaze from their faults and consider instead the incredible love that we have received. The recognition of the

generosity showered upon us will prompt us to be generous to others too.

Sure, we should bask in God's grace and favor. But we must go further. People – especially the ones we think undeserving – need love. God has loved us so we can actually love them.

We are loved to love.
