DOORMATS FOR JESUS?

MESSAGE FROM PASTOR



Ephesians 4:32
Be kind to one another,
tenderhearted, forgiving one
another, as God in Christ
forgave you.

Nobody wants to be a doormat.

Yet it seems like if we obey Jesus' instructions to develop grace-based relationships we

risk being treated as doormats. Why would Christ put those He loves into such a potentially challenging position?

Grace-based relationships insist on treating people – even (or especially?) difficult ones with patience, understanding, and kindness. This approach goes against our natural tendencies. We are more likely to treat difficult persons with impatience and harshness. But when we consider Jesus' grace-based prescription, we discover that it has benefits

for each member of the relationship. Today we will focus primarily on how it benefits the obedient Christian. We discover that grace-based responses help to moderate at least two unhelpful qualities that we possess: our harshness and our hastiness.

While we do not like to admit it, we as human beings are extremely vengeful people. When we experience wrong, we want to retaliate at least in kind – but most times with greater intensity. If we practice this approach often enough, we begin to harden on the inside. Our desire for retribution grows so strong that we are quick to strike back and hurt those who hurt us – even our loved ones. And the scary thing is we scarcely recognize how harsh we are becoming. After all, we tell ourselves, we are only responding to a difficult person who deserves all he gets. But that harshness is directly opposed to the tender heart God wants to develop in us. That is why God calls us to leave vengeance to Him. He is capable of dispensing justice without becoming hardened in the process.

Not only are we harsh, but we are hasty. We chafe

at having to wait for anything. We want what we want. And we want it now. Yet the best things in life require patience, so our haste generally breeds inferior results . Jesus uses the powerful symbol of farming to show that there is a period between sowing and reaping. We need to learn to wait for the best results. In fact, our true rewards and vindication await us in Heaven. Choosing to pursue grace-based relationships shifts our focus from immediate, fleshly gratification to the lasting eternal rewards that can be ours only in Heaven. What if God's ultimate purpose for grace-based relationships is to help make us more like Him? Who doesn't want to be more like our glorious Lord Jesus Christ?

May God help us realize that grace-based relationships aren't intended to make us doormats, but rather offer us the opportunities to be mirrors of our Lord's patience and tenderheartedness.
