JUST ASK

MESSAGE FROM PASTOR



Matthew 7:7-11
 “Ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you. 8 For everyone who asks receives, and the one who seeks finds, and to the one who knocks it will be opened. 9 Or which one of you, if his son asks him for bread, will give him a stone?

10 Or if he asks for a fish, will give him a serpent? 11 If you then, who are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your Father who is in heaven give good things to those who ask him!”

Christ invites us to ask, so that we can receive what we ask from God. This promise is based on two important aspects of God’s

character.

The first aspect is God’s generosity. God longs to bless and is happy to bless us. Many of us live with the delusion that God hates blessing us and doles out only the stingiest blessings when we pressure and cajole Him. How sad! The Bible presentation is of a God who lavishes His care on His children. Those who serve Him have no lack. David declares in Psalm 23 that because God is his shepherd, he lacks nothing. Paul echoes that sentiment in the New Testament by noting that God does “exceedingly abundantly” beyond anything we could ask or imagine.

Not only is God generous, but He is also good. God gives only good gifts. This passage argues that if fallen, sinful human parents can give good gifts to their children, how much more will God give good gifts to those who ask Him. The Lord will not give a stone in answer

to a prayer for bread, or a serpent in response to a prayer for fish.


In the light of this wonderful promise, what are we to make of the times when our prayers go unanswered? We passionately petition God for items we consider critical, yet He does not give it to us. I wonder if the problem is that in many of those instances, we are inadvertently asking God for serpents, but, being the God He is, He is offering a fish instead. Because we are ignorant of the fact that we were asking for serpents, we are disappointed with God when we should be rejoicing that He gave us much better than we asked for.

Pray to God in confidence. If He does not give what we ask, rest in the assurance that our generous God gives only good gifts.
