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# MOVED BY COMPASSION

#### MESSAGE FROM PASTOR



Matthew 14:13-14
Now when Jesus heard this, he
withdrew from there in a boat
to a desolate place by himself.
But when the crowds heard
it, they followed him on foot
from the towns. When he went
ashore he saw a great crowd,
and he had compassion on
them and healed their sick.

Jesus needed a moment. Having just received the news of the beheading of his cousin and forerunner John the Baptist, He decided to go away to a desolate place for a while. It seems like He wanted to mourn the loss of John, and to find some solace in solitude. He got into a boat and departed. When He arrived at the other shore, He found waiting for Him ... a crowd of people!

Have you ever needed a moment? Just a little break from the challenges and demands of life. Per-

haps you have suffered a loss. Perhaps you are dealing with some personal issue. Perhaps you are just drained from constantly giving and giving. So, you arrange a well-needed break – only to find that your responsibilities, like rabid paparazzi, have pursued you there. How would you respond?

When Jesus saw the crowd that had doggedly followed Him He experienced an intense emotion – and His reaction showed it. No. It wasn't anger. Nor was it frustration. It was compassion. As He looked at the ragtag crowd, He saw beyond the nuisance they appeared to be. He saw people who had pursued Him because they had deep needs only He could meet. So, he ministered to them in all the ways they needed. He healed their sick. He taught them the Word of God. And when evening came, He refused to send them away hungry. He miraculously multiplied a young lad's lunch to feed the more than five thousand people gathered there. Then after dismissing the sated crowd, He went off by Himself to commune with His Father (verse 23).

It is healthy to take occasional breaks. We are fi-

nite beings who need rest and revitalization. That is how God made us. Yet, there will be times when we'll need to sacrifice or postpone our breaks so we can minister to people with urgent needs. We need to ask God to help us develop compassionate hearts that will move us to respond to opportunities He places in our paths — even if at first they seem like nuisances.

Praise God that Jesus was moved with compassion not only for that crowd, but for the whole world. That is why He left Heaven to come to earth to die on the cross for us so we can be delivered from our sin.

May God help us grow in the compassion like our Savior.
